What your solicitor will do

- Take full information from you in relation to the background
- · Consider your goals and what is important for your children
- · Advise you of your options to agree matters and advise of the applicable law
- · Agree a plan and next

You will need to

- Provide full information in relation to your circumstances
- · Provide your instructions as to how you wish to proceed

Timescales

1 month

Agreeing on arrangements for your children

What your solicitor will do

- · Correspondence with your former partner/their solicitor
- Put forward your position supported with relevant legal principles
- · Explore the best forum to agree matters e.g. correspondence, meeting or mediation
- Identify if agreement cannot be reached what other routes are available and which is most suitable e.g. court or arbitration.

You will need to

· Provide your instructions

Timescales

2 months - 6 months



Making arrangements for children, explained

The court process

Up to and including First Hearing Dispute Resolution **Appointment** (FHDRA)

What your solicitor will do

- Prepare court application if you are the applicant setting out proposals and concerns to court
- · If you are the other party who the application is made against, advise you about the procedure
- Assist in preparation for CAFCASS call with you
- · Consider any evidence required
- Prepare for hearing and narrow issues
- · Represent at hearing or instruct a barrister to represent you

You will need to

- Provide your instructions
- Speak with CAFCASS
- Attend the hearing to give instructions and listen to the court's feedback on the merits of the application.

Timescales

1 month - 3 months

If a Fact

What your solicitor will do

- Advise you about procedure for your specific case
- Consider the evidence in
- Assist you in preparing your witness statement and details of allegations or response and/or counter allegations
- Prepare for the hearing and consider narrowing issues with possible admissions
- Represent at hearing or instruct a barrister
- Advise on implications and effect of outcome

You will need to

- Provide your instructions and full details relating to the allegations
- Assist fully in producing your evidence
- Attend the hearing to give instructions and give evidence and listen to the court's findings

Timescales

1 month - 3 months

Up to and including second hearing Dispute Resolution

What your solicitor will do

- Consider any experts reports obtained
- Advise in relation to otions for resolution in light of expert evidence
- Prepare for hearing
- Represent at hearing or instruct a barrister

You will need to

- · Provide your instructions
- Meet with CAFCASS in relation to any Section 7 report
- Attend the hearing

Timescales

3 months - 6 months

Up to and including Final Hearing

What your solicitor will do

- Advise on possible outcomes
- Draft statement on your behalf
- Prepare your case for hearing
- Collate and present all necessary evidence to the Court
- Advise on the process of giving evidence
- Instruct a barrister to represent you at the hearing

You will need to

- Provide your instructions
- Attend the hearing to give evidence to the Court

Timescales

6 months - 12 months
